

SEC. 18-112 PROHIBITION ON DEMOLITION

During the period of the year commencing December 1st and ending March 1st of the following year, demolition of structures shall be prohibited and no permits for demolition of structures shall be issued by the Town during said periods.

As of March 1, 2007 the responsibility for code enforcement in the Town of Palm Beach was transferred to the Police Department.

One of the priorities for the Code Enforcement Unit is to gain voluntary compliance from the construction industry.

Contractors and other construction personnel who are unwilling or unable to comply with the ordinances, rules, and regulations will be subject to increased enforcement by police officers, code enforcement officers and parking enforcement officers.

Some of the most frequent violations are summarized in this flyer.

SEC. 42-199
Hours for Construction

PEAK SEASON HOURS

December 1st thru April 30th (5 months)

- Mondays thru Fridays
Start work at 9 am
Stop work at 5 pm
- Saturdays
ONLY QUIET INTERIOR WORK ALLOWED
(no exterior construction work allowed)
Start work at 9 am
Stop work at 5 pm
- Sundays and Town holidays
No construction permitted
- NO HEAVY EQUIPMENT OR OTHER
CONSTRUCTION NOISE PERMITTED
PRIOR TO 9 AM
- ONLY QUIET WORK (interior and
exterior) may start at 8 am

Quiet work is defined as work which cannot be heard from the public right-of-way or from a neighboring property line.

OFF SEASON HOURS

May 1st thru November 30th (7 months)

- Mondays thru Saturdays
Start work at 8 am
Stop work at 6 pm
- Sundays and Town holidays,
including the day after
Thanksgiving
No construction work permitted

WORTH AVENUE HOURS
(C-WA DISTRICT)

Work permitted May 1st thru October 31st
ONLY Unless given permission by the Town Council

- Work allowed 8 am—8 pm
Monday thru Saturday
- Work NOT ALLOWED
Sundays and Town holidays

SEC. 42-198 Operation of Certain Machinery during Winter, Saturdays, Sundays and Legal Holidays—including the Friday after Thanksgiving

PEAK SEASON

December 1st thru April 30th (5 months)

- The operation of the following machinery is PROHIBITED: dredges, hammer-driven pile drivers, gasoline, diesel or steam engines which emit offensive odors or noises, dry sandblasting machines, pneumatic jackhammers AND any other class of machinery or appliance that when used would render the enjoyment of the property less agreeable.
- EXCEPTIONS: It shall be within the discretion of the Town Council to grant permission for the use of prohibited machinery or appliances. Further, the operation of equipment relating to essential services of the Town and equipment operation during emergency conditions shall be exempt from these restrictions.

SEC. 118-14 MARKING OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

- It is unlawful for any commercial vehicle to operate on the streets in the Town without having the name of the owner displayed in a prominent place on each side of the vehicle in letters not less than two inches in height.

SEC. 18-233 CONSTRUCTION WITHOUT A PERMIT

- Any owner or authorized agent who intends to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish or convert a building or building system is first required to obtain the necessary permits. Construction work conducted without first obtaining the required permit(s) will be subject to a fine and be required to obtain required permit(s) from the Planning, Zoning & Building Department where they may be subject to additional permit fees.

PARKING

- All equipment, contractor and employee vehicles must be parked on the construction site at all times, except vehicles correctly displaying a valid right-of-way permit.
- The permit must be displayed in the front windshield area for each vehicle and only original permits are valid.
- Right-of-way permits only grant permission to park in metered spaces and spaces designating a maximum number of parking hours.
- Parking in "PERMIT PARKING ONLY" IS PROHIBITED.
- Parking on sidewalks and medians is prohibited.
- Failure to comply may result in suspension of work, fines and cancellation of permits. Violators will be fined \$75 per day per vehicle for the first offense and \$150 per day per vehicle for subsequent offenses. In addition to citing the general constructor for right-of-way violations, violators of parking restrictions will be issued a parking ticket.
